Fewer flood evacuees

KUALA LUMPUR: The number of flood victims in flood relief centres in Sabah and Sarawak dropped yesterday because of good weather.

In Sabah, flood victims at relief centres dropped to 682 at noon, compared with 1,233 people in the morning, while Sarawak recorded a slight drop from 1,684 to 1,587. In Kelantan, the number remained at 255.

In Sabah, a Beaufort Flood Operations Room spokesman said 58 victims were housed at a relief centre in the district, a drop from 195, while there were 314 victims

housed at two relief centres in Membakut.

In Sarawak, Samarahan has the biggest number of victims at 788, Limbang (475), Miri (249) and Mukah (75).

In Kelantan, 255 victims from 62 families were staying at eight centres in Kuala Krai.

As of 8am yesterday, a state National Security Council spokesman said the victims were staying at schools, factories and mosques since their homes were swept away in the floods last month. **Berna-**
